



Visa options for business conferences, seminars, trade fairs and expos

This table provides a quick reference guide to the type of visa you may be eligible to apply for. Please refer to the information on the Department’s website www.homeaffairs.gov.au to ensure you apply for the most appropriate visa.

| <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Speaker, presenter, exhibitor, or other contributor invited to participate in an event by an Australian organisation. | Temporary Activity (subclass 408) visa Activity type: Invited Participant in an event | Up to 3 months. |
| <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Performer or entertainer. Media personnel covering an event(s), where the production is intended for Australian audiences. | Temporary Activity (subclass 408) visa Activity type: Entertainment | Up to 2 years * Sponsorship is required for stays of more than 3 months or if you apply from within Australia. |
| <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Media personnel covering an event(s), where the production is <u>not</u> intended for Australian audiences Persons who are otherwise working at an event - such as a project manager; site supervisor; or other highly specialised worker. | Temporary Work (Short Stay Specialist) (subclass 400) visa | Up to 3 months *Up to 6 months may be allowed in limited circumstances. |
